!. Disparity between rate payers

I am deeply concerned about the unequal treatment of acreage owners compared to residents in the hamlets. While acreage owners are responsible for covering the costs of their own water, sewer, and road calcium, it has come to my attention that residents in the hamlets receive significant subsidies.

The disparity is stark: hamlet residents benefit from subsidized water and sewer services, along with the provision of free calcium for their roads. On the other hand, acreage owners are burdened with the full cost of these essential services. This discrepancy raises questions of fairness and equity within our community.

Additionally, under the new policy, the road servicing the acreage owners will see no special treatment, despite their continued contributions to the community. This road, which is vital for their access and connectivity, will no longer receive the attention it requires.

I believe it is crucial for these disparities to be addressed and rectified to ensure fairness for all residents, regardless of their location within our community. We should strive for a system where everyone has equal access to necessary services without undue financial strain.

Concern Number 2: Management of Brush Piles

My concern is about the brush piles that have been left untouched due to the dry winter and lack of moisture making it unsafe to burn them. It is my belief that these brush piles, if left unattended, will lead to further costs being added to the Damage Reduction Program (DRP).

The upcoming spring will require the land owner/grazing lease holder to seed the land to prevent weeds and to establish a strong forage crop. However, if we wait until the following winter to burn the brush piles, there is a risk that the equipment used in the burning process could damage the newly seeded land. This would necessitate the land owner/grazing lease holder to return the following spring to repair and reseed the areas that have been disturbed, including where the brush pile was located.

I am wondering if there might be alternative options to burning that the DRP could consider. These options could potentially mitigate the risk of damage to the newly seeded land while still addressing the need to manage the brush piles effectively.

Concern: Fair Treatment and Advocacy in Disaster Recovery Program

Issue:

Received a phone call regarding the fairness and transparency of the Disaster Recovery Program (DRP) and Md. It appears that there may be inconsistencies in how individuals are being treated, raising questions about whether everyone is receiving equitable assistance.

Background:

Instances have surfaced where residents are being informed that their entitlements under the DRP are determined based on what their neighbors have received, rather than on their individual circumstances. Additionally, discrepancies have been noted in the compensation for fire fighting efforts compared to their neighbors. This has led to apprehension among residents about the fairness of the process.

Consultant's Role:

There is ambiguity surrounding the role of the consultant tasked with managing the DRP. Is their primary objective to advocate for the best interests of ratepayers and the MD, by ensuring they receive adequate support, or are they primarily focused on minimizing costs for the government and municipality? Clarity on this matter would be greatly appreciated

Proposed Action:

It is imperative to address these concerns promptly. Advocating for a fair and transparent DRP is essential to maintaining trust within the community. Consideration should be given to implementing measures such as utilizing a five-year average for crop assessments, This will help ensure that assistance provided through the DRP accurately reflects the extent of individual losses and needs.

By addressing these issues and advocating for fair treatment and transparency, we can uphold the integrity of the DRP and provide much-needed support to those impacted by disasters in our community.
